RESOLUTION NO. 2024-01

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF RICHLAND, WASHINGTON, AMENDING THE 2024-2029 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM REGARDING THE SOUTH GEORGE WASHINGTON WAY INTERSECTION IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT DESCRIPTION.

WHEREAS, RCW 35.77.010 requires local jurisdictions to prepare and adopt a six-year Transportation Improvement Program (TIP); and

WHEREAS, on June 6, 2023, by Resolution No. 2023-85, Richland City Council adopted the 2024-2029 TIP, which included the South George Washington Way Intersection Improvements Project; and

WHEREAS, the scope of the project includes a grade-separated pedestrian crossing; and

WHEREAS, the City's effort to fund the grade-separated pedestrian crossing element of the project through grants was unsuccessful; and

WHEREAS, the intersection improvement without a grade-separated pedestrian crossing will provide significant benefit to the City; and

WHEREAS, major scope changes require an amendment to the project description in the TIP to facilitate the Washington State Department of Transportation's environmental review of the project; and

WHEREAS, as required by state law, Richland City Council held a public hearing on January 2, 2024 to receive public input on the proposed amendment to the 2024-2029 Six-Year Transportation Improvement Program to change the project description for the South George Washington Way Intersection Improvements Project by removing the grade-separated pedestrian crossing project element; and

WHEREAS, the City's best interests are served by amending the 2024-2029 TIP to continue the required steps in project delivery for the South George Washington Way Intersection Improvements Project.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Richland that the 2024-2029 Six-Year Transportation Improvement Program is hereby amended to change the project description of the South George Washington Way Intersection Improvements Project by removing reference to a grade-separated pedestrian crossing as reflected in **Exhibit A**.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution shall take effect immediately.
