PAVEMENT PRESERVATION PROGRAM

The City of Richland Public Works Department is preparing to begin the annual Pavement Preservation Program. Citizens who will be directly impacted by upcoming construction will be receiving a postcard in the coming weeks.

The Pavement Preservation Program includes applications such as microsurfacing, slurry seal, overlay and other types of treatments. This year, efforts will focus on central Richland. Preparatory project work, including crack sealing, has already started with the main pavement preservation work scheduled for this summer.

DIGITAL PERMITTING PORTAL

The City of Richland's Permitting Office is moving to an all-digital permitting process beginning Monday, June 3, 2024. The self-service portal will allow applicants to apply for Building Permits, Planning Applications, Right-of-Way Permits and Fire Permits online via desktop, mobile, and other devices, making it a convenient way for applicants to complete and track permit activities.
